

It's the final month to meet the district PolioPlus goal

We are at the end of May 2016 with just one more month left in our 2015-16 Rotary year. We as a district have contributed \$29,994 to PolioPlus Year-To-Date. This is 75 percent of our \$40,000 goal. For the past two years we have exceeded our annual goal. We still have time to get there.

The May RI PolioPlus report was an eye-opener for me. This is the first year of my three-year stint as the District PolioPlus Chair that our District has not contributed to the PolioPlus fund. Also, of the 52 District 6490 clubs 42.5 percent

have not yet made a contribution either as a club or by individual club members. We are so close to conquering this dreaded disease that we can't ease up now. The RI stated goal is to have polio eradicated worldwide by 2018. We still have time to meet our annual goal of \$40,000.

On the global front, the World Health

Ministers are convening in Geneva, Switzerland, and will review the latest polio data. Canada has contributed \$19.9 million to support Nigeria's polio eradication efforts. From April 17 to May 1, 155 countries and territories participated in the trivalent to bivalent oral polio vaccine switch to protect against the Type 2 polio.

is Rotary?" I believe the answer lies within our clubs. We provide service without expecting recognition.



Rotary clubs in Charleston, Mattoon, Arcola and Tuscola have sponsored this project for more than 20 years.

C-U Illini hosts speech contest

C-U Illini After 5

Hannah King won the 13th Annual David Jones Persuasive Speaking Contest at Parkland College, which was held with the assistance of the C-U Illini After 5 Rotary Club.

King spoke to persuade the audience to adopt the Eastern Illinois Foodbank as the charity of the evening. A grant from Rotary District 6490 to the C-U Illini After 5 Rotary Club helped sponsor the event this year. King won \$500 for the Foodbank and \$500 for herself.

The David Jones Persuasive Speech Contest honors long-time former department chair, Dr. David Jones. Any student who has completed a COM course at Parkland College is eligible to participate. Students are required to pick a 501(c) (3) charity, research it and prepare a 5- to 7-minute speech seeking to persuade the audience to adopt that charity.

Students are assigned to groups of 5-7 for a preliminary ground. Preliminary rounds are judged by current speech faculty, two judges per group and no judge may evaluate a current or former student of their own class. The top one or two are selected out of each group to go on to a final round. Final round judges are selected from members of the community who have extensive experience in hearing charity appeals.

C-U Illini After 5 Rotary has supported the speaking contest by providing for the first place awards to the speaker and their charity. C-U IA5 has provided this support for a number of years, but when the current Illinois budget crisis threatened to cause the event to be canceled, C-U IA5 successfully wrote a grant from District designated funds to help provide additional support.
